The Network of Care Web site is a comprehensive, Internet-based community resource for older adults, people with disabilities, their families, caregivers and service providers.

This easy-to-use Web resource provides an extensive directory to put people in touch with the right services at the right time. It also offers vital information about diseases, medications, assistive devices and caregiving, as well as daily news from around the world related to aging and disabilities. This unique, one-stop information tool enables you to keep personal records, create an online family meeting place, and communicate directly with elected officials to make your voice heard in the legislative halls.

There are six links at the top of the page to help meet your needs: **Service Directory, Library, Assistive Devices, Links, Legislate** and **My PHR**.

Additional local information, resources and links are accessible from the menu located on the left side of the main page. Using the **Planning Your Future** link, you can assess and plan for your current and future needs for long-term care services and supports.

About the Service Directory

The Network of Care Service Directory is the first database of its kind. It is a comprehensive database of local community resources for consumers, caregivers and service providers. It was designed to be easily used by anyone who wants to find local services by category. The resources in the Service Directory are maintained and updated regularly by 211 San Diego to ensure the highest accuracy.

The Service Directory is extremely important in enabling people to make greater use of home and community based services, so they can stay in their own homes, as independent as possible for as long as possible.

Now, let's review how you can navigate the Service Directory.

How you can use the Service Directory

You can search for community listings four ways: the **Category Search**, the **Program/Agency Name Search**, the **Keyword Search** and the **Advanced Search**. Here are some examples of how you can use each of these search functions.

The **Library** is a deep bank of educational information about diseases, conditions, medications, research and a wide variety of other important topics, to help you better understand and handle their own living circumstances associated with aging and disabilities. It also includes a section of articles specifically for caregivers.

The library includes **Key Health Articles, Medications, Medical Tests, Support Groups, Interactive Tools, Symptom Checker** and **All Health Topics by Category**. You can also use the **Keyword Search** either by typing a word or phrase to help locate what you are searching for. Or, you can search alphabetically by clicking on a letter.

The Audible Battery Tester is designed for persons who are blind or have low vision. The device tests 9-volt, AA, AAA, C, D, and N size batteries. The user places the battery in the tester, and then presses a button. As the button is pressed, a continuous beep is heard if the battery has power. The louder the beep, the more power remains in the battery. The Audible Battery Tester also has a light indicator for those who can see....[\[More Information\]](#)

You can use your CAC for authentication on this site. Click the button below to associate a CAC with this PHR account. Be sure your card reader is connected, and the card you will be using is in the reader.

The **My PHR** Link allows you to establish and maintain an **electronic personal health record**. If you are a **new user** you will have to create an account. If you are an **existing user**, you will login each time you access your PHR using the username and password you created when you set up your account. If you forgot your password you simply click on **lost password** and enter your user name. If you forgot your username, you can contact **Network of Care Feedback and Support** via email. Once you have set up an account you can start managing your health through your Personal Health Record.

The PHR is an online file that stores your medical, legal and financial information. You can add a note and import documents into each section of your PHR. The benefit of the PHR to you is that you can access it quickly and easily share it with trusted friends, family and service providers. You also create personalized lists of useful agencies, articles, and legislation that you gather throughout the Network of Care site, and save them in **My PHR** for quick reference

The PHR was designed to allow you to organize and store important personal, health care and supportive service related information in different sections. A description of many of these sections is provided below.

Patient Preferences: In this section, you can communicate your preferences for care, treatment, service provision, religion or anything else that you choose.

Self Assessments: Here you can save self assessments that you have completed using the Interactive Tools that are available on the Network of Care.

Treatment Plans: Your doctor and other health care and supportive service providers create a plan to improve your health and wellbeing. You can request an electronic copy of the plan and save it to this section of your PHR.

Family History: Having information about your family member's health history is important because that information can provide you and your formal and informal caregivers helpful insights into your genetic health risks and predispositions. You can easily save this information in this section.

Health Maintenance: Keeping track of your goals and tasks to maintain your health is very important to self-managing your health. In this part of the PHR, you can record information about self-care, preventive care, and wellness tasks and activities.

Healthcare Providers: Having contact information for your healthcare providers readily available is not only a time-saver, it is particularly important in the event that you need emergency care. You can use this section for just that purpose.

Health Facilities: In this section, you can record the hospitals, clinics, day treatment programs and other health facilities that you visit. This is great information to share with your formal and informal caregivers.

Conditions: How many times are you asked to identify your health conditions? In this section, you can list your allergies, diseases or other general conditions and have the information readily available for the asking.

Medical History: Storing information about your dental treatment, diagnostic procedures, doctor visits, hospitalizations, immunizations, medications, physical and occupational therapy treatments, surgeries and vision care is critical to self-managing your health. In this section, you have the opportunity to enter all of this information into your PHR and can even share with others that are involved in your care.

Medical Devices: Do you use any medical devices? If so, you can list them in this section.

Insurance: Wouldn't it be helpful to have all of your insurance information in one place? Well now you can. In this section, you can list information about all of your insurance providers. You can even save electronic copies of your policies if you want to.

Legal Documents: Storing information about your Living Will, Durable Power of Attorney, Advanced Directive, Trust, Funeral and Burial Plans or other legal documents in one place and making them readily available to those that need to access them is critical. Here you can store that information for your own reference and share it with whoever you choose.

Service Documents: Need a place to store service agreements with your supportive service providers such as your housekeeper, gardener, care manager, transportation provider, etc.? Well that is exactly how you can use this section of the PHR.

Services and Resources: Is it hard for you to keep track of all of the different people and organizations that are helping you? In this section, you can maintain a list of everyone involved in your care and share that information with all of those providers so that they can help coordinate your care.

Notes: In this folder, you can add additional notes or anything that you choose.

WRAP: In the Wellness Recovery Action Plan (WRAP), you can assess your current wellness and plan for health improvement. In addition to storing your important health, insurance and legal information in the PHR, there are other things that you can do within the **My PHR**. For example, you can print your entire PHR or just specific sections of your PHR anytime you choose. You can also create an **Emergency Card** and a **Care Coordination Card** as well as grant access to anyone you choose in the My PHR.

Emergency Card:

The Emergency Card is a tool that you create and carry with you at all times. It contains important information about your health and medical history in case of a medical emergency. After finalizing the information, you can request that a laminated card be mailed to you free of charge. You are also free to share your Emergency Card with anyone that you choose.

Care Coordination Card:

The Care Coordination Card is a helpful tool that allows you to keep all important contact information in one place. You can add anyone from a medical provider to a next door neighbor. After completing the information, you can request that a free laminated card be sent to you. Once again, you can share this card with others.

Grant Visitor Access:

Caregivers, family members and service providers can readily access all of the links in Network of Care except the **My PHR**. A user name and password is required to access this personal information. Everyone needs your permission to view your PHR. This access could be important to learn about medications, physicians, and hospitalization information.

Through the **Grant Visitor Access** link in the **My PHR**, you authorize others to access your information. You can allow anyone you choose access, including caregivers, physicians, health care and social service providers, neighbors, children and friends. There are three levels of access. The first level of access is read only. With this option, the person is only allowed to view your information in the sections of your PHR that you grant them access to. The second level of access is **read/write**. This level allows the person to view the information and add notes and upload documents directly into the sections of your PHR that you grant them access to. You can also grant **no access** to any sections of the PHR that you choose. There may be some information that you want to keep confidential and do not want anyone to see. You have control over what information is shared and with whom. All information that is entered into your PHR is stored on a secure server, so you don't ever have to worry that your information will be seen by anyone other than those that you allow access.
